 - WTM – Walking talking mocks



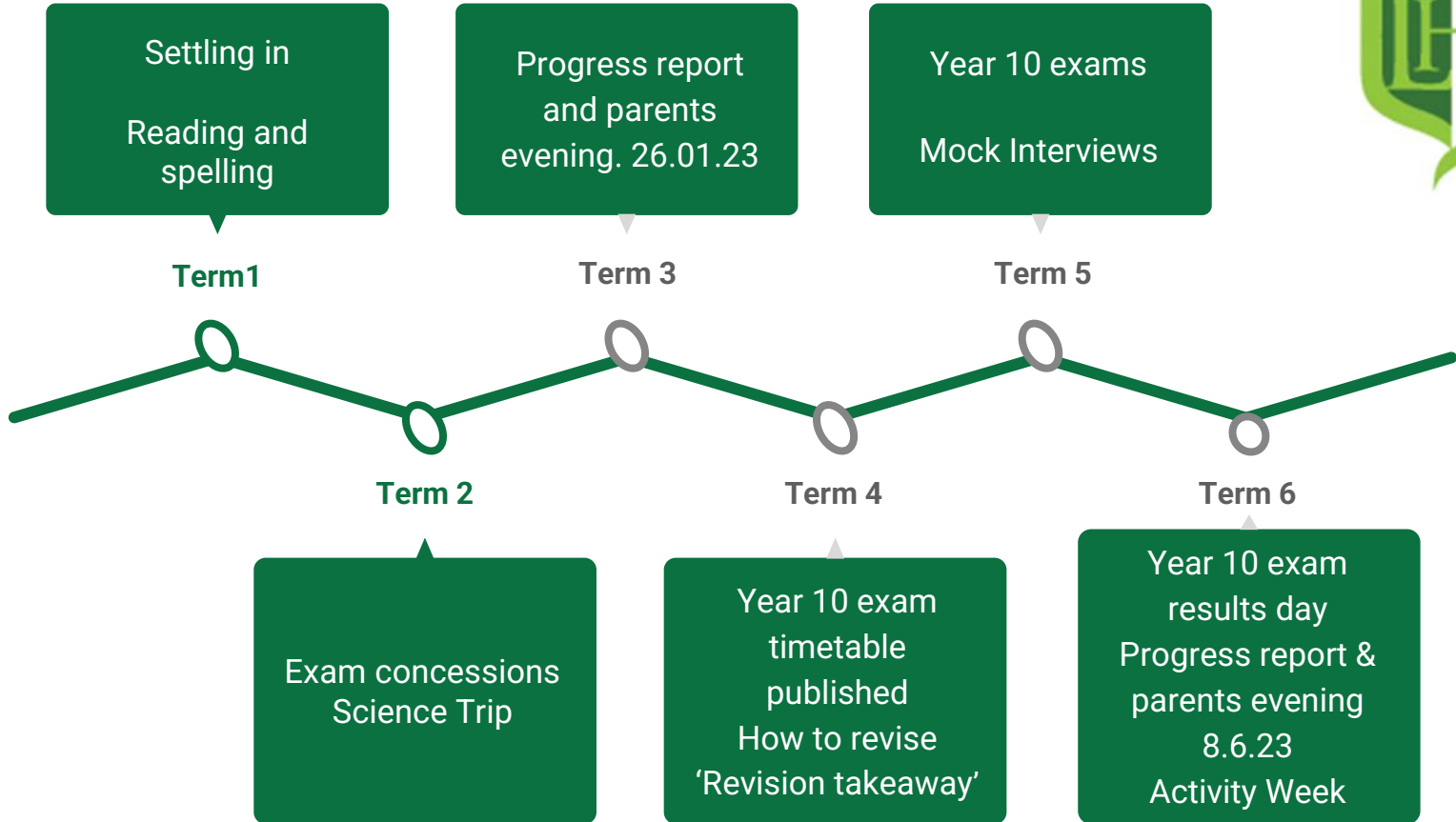
Post pandemic changes to exams



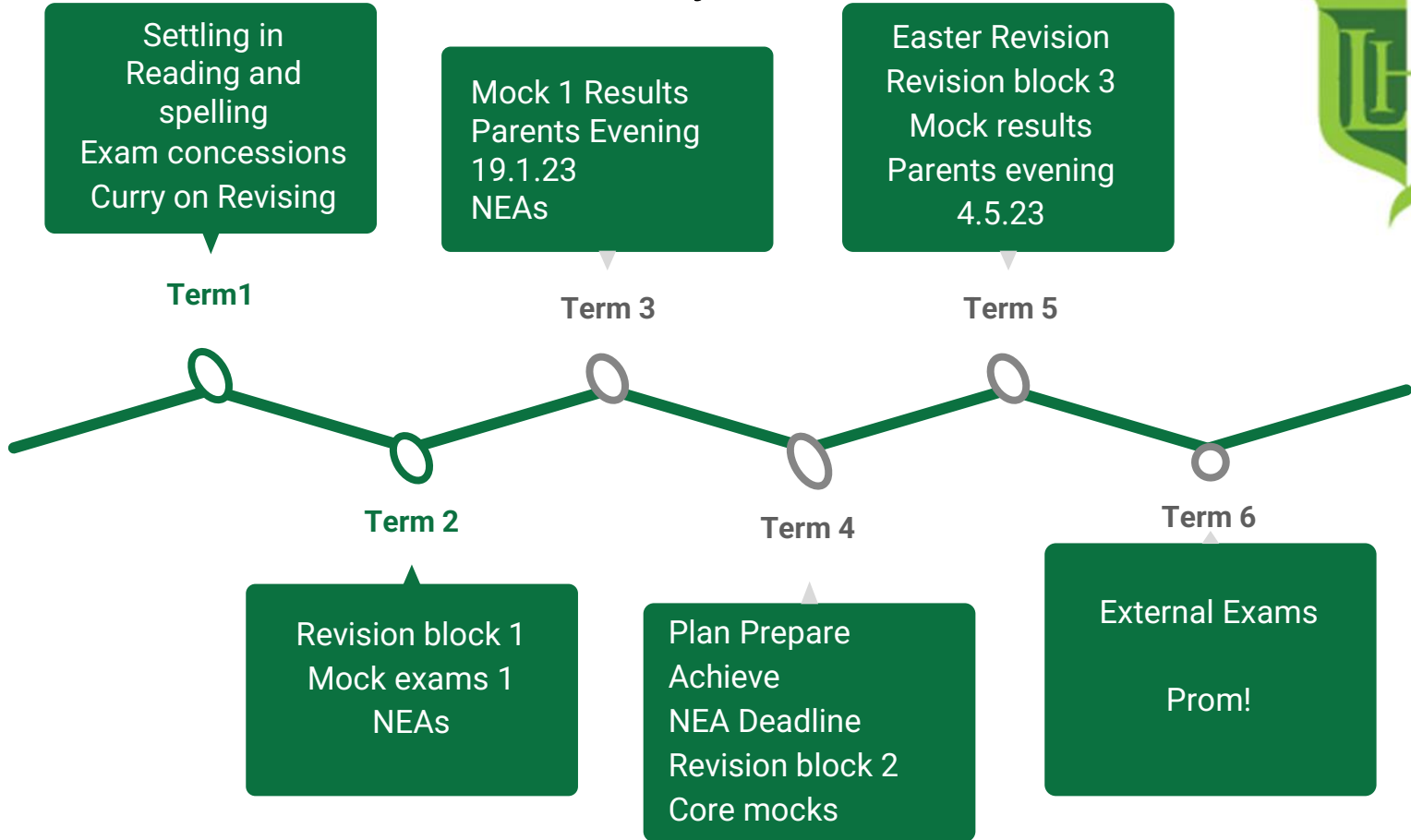
- Adaptations to exams in previous years

Exam stress symptoms

- Difficulty getting to sleep or difficulty waking up in the morning
- Constant tiredness
- Forgetfulness
- Unexplained aches and pains
- Poor appetite
- Loss of interest in activities
- Increased anxiety and irritability
- Increased heart rate
- Migraines/headaches
- Blurred vision
- Dizziness

2022 GCSE outcomes at Lutterworth High School

Attendance	Average Grade	'Value Added'
Above 96%	6.1	+1.2
90.1% – 96%	5.3	+0.6
80.1% - 90%	4.5	+0.3
50.1% - 80%	4.1	0.0
0 – 50%	3.5	-0.8

Homework

- Learning Hub available before school, break, lunch & afterschool
- Homework in E7 every lunchtime with LSA support
- Access to computers and a quiet space to work
- Guide - 1 hour, per week, per subject



Part-time employment

Term time rules

During term time children can only work a maximum of 12 hours a week. This includes:

- a maximum of 2 hours on school days and Sundays
- a maximum of 5 hours on Saturdays for 13 to 14-year-olds, or 8 hours for 15 to 16-year-olds

School holiday rules

During school holidays 13 to 14-year-olds are only allowed to work a maximum of 25 hours a week. This includes:

- a maximum of 5 hours on weekdays and Saturdays
- a maximum of 2 hours on Sunday

During school holidays 15 to 16-year-olds can only work a maximum of 35 hours a week. This includes:

- a maximum of 8 hours on weekdays and Saturdays
- a maximum of 2 hours on Sunday

- Exam timetables (rooms and seating)
- Reports
- Parents evening booking
- Attendance and punctuality to lessons
- Achievements and behaviour

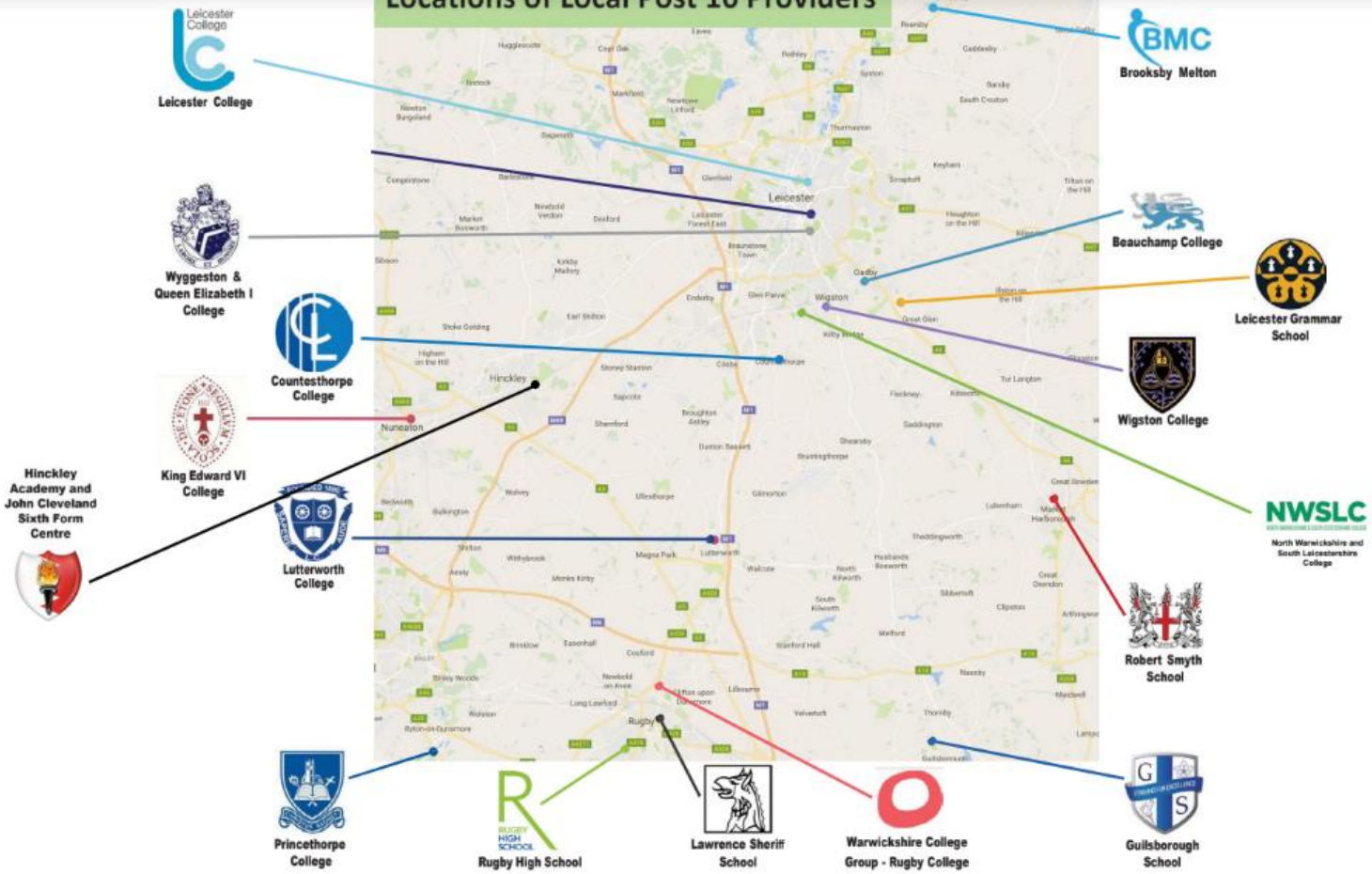

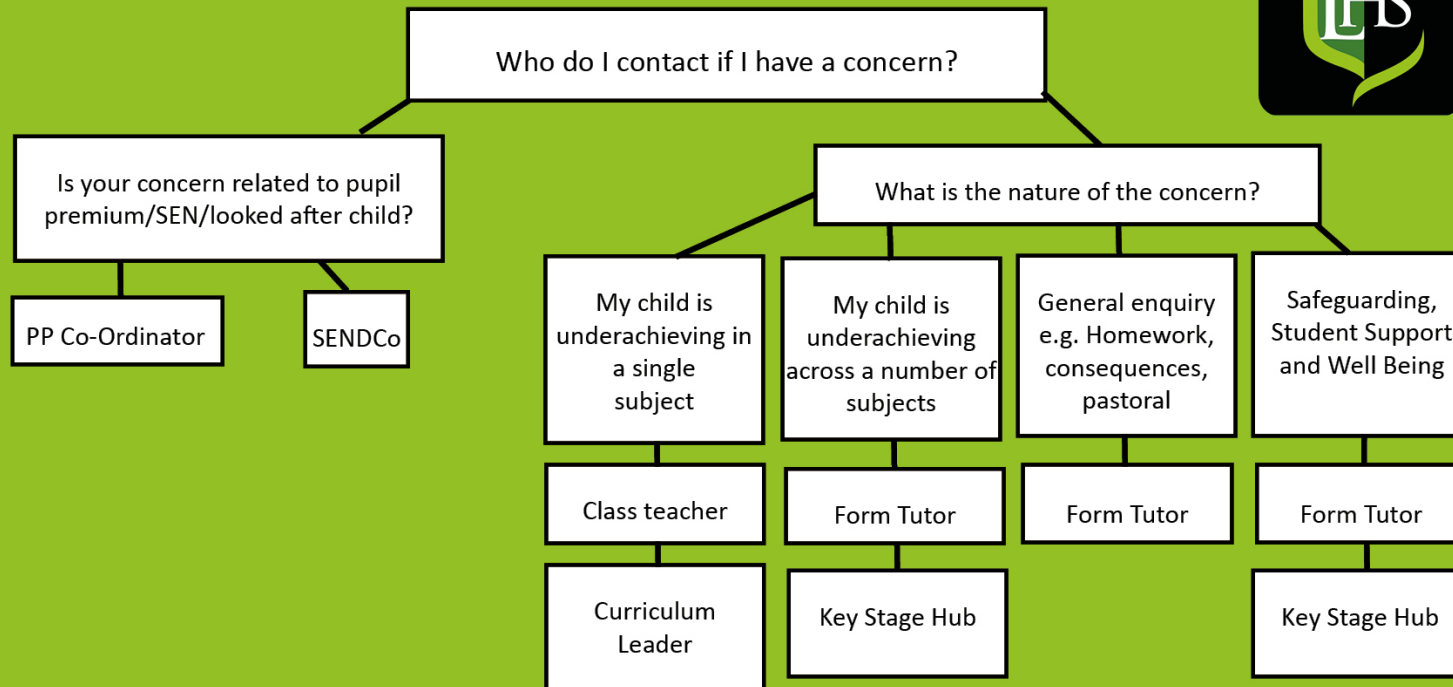
Locations of Local Post 16 Providers
