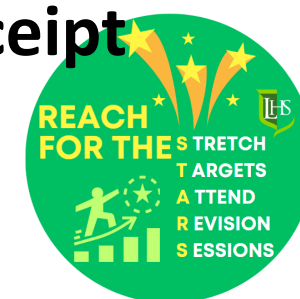

Exam stress symptoms

- Difficulty getting to sleep or difficulty waking up in the morning
- Constant tiredness
- Forgetfulness
- Unexplained aches and pains
- Poor appetite
- Loss of interest in activities
- Increased anxiety and irritability
- Increased heart rate
- Migraines/headaches
- Blurred vision
- Dizziness

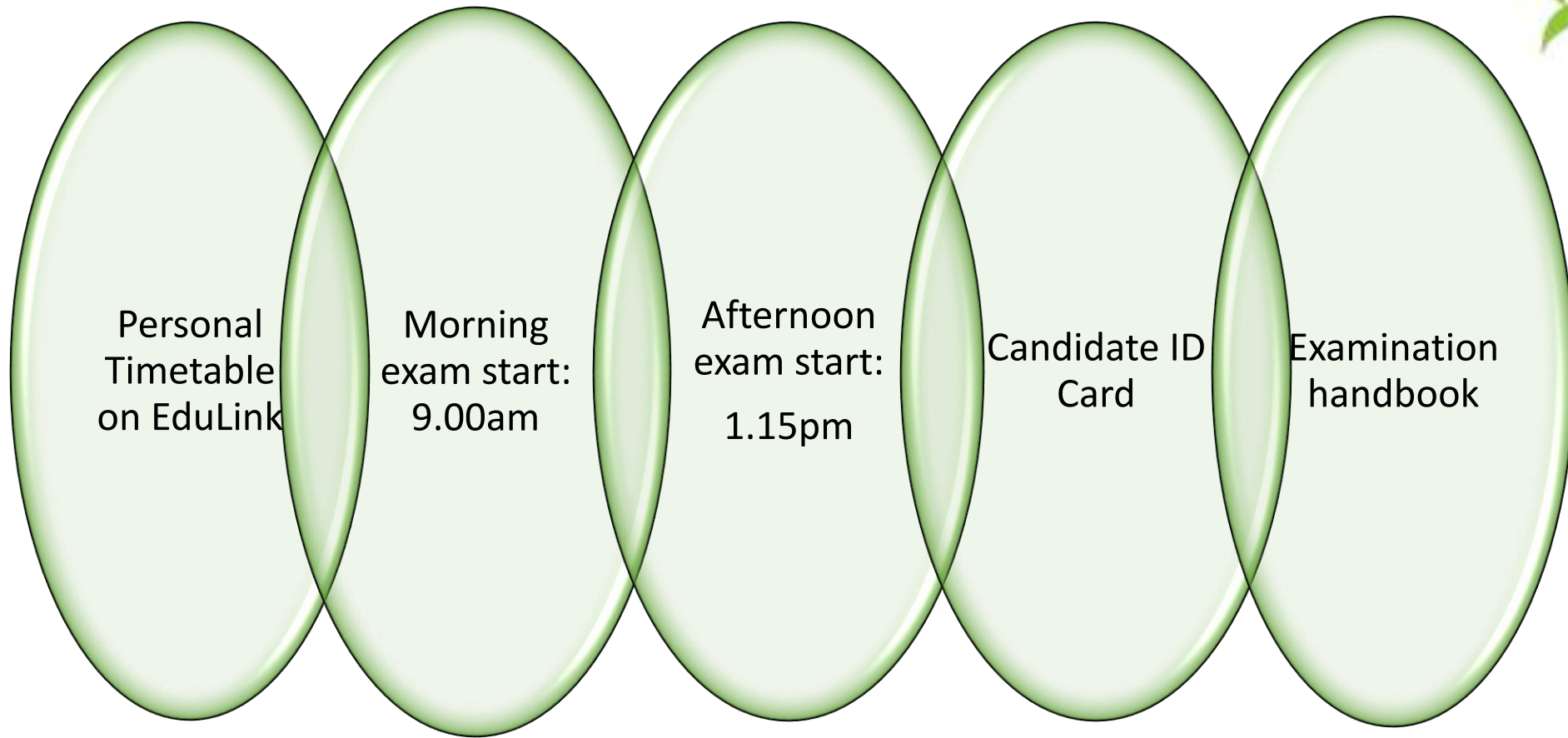

- 2 BLACK biro pens (No 'gel' pens)
- a pencil
- an eraser

- For certain exams, such as Mathematics, Geography and Science, you will also need:
 - a compass
 - a protractor
 - a calculator (No lid)

Water in a clear plastic bottle-no label
No watches or phones



Illness or Injury

- Not attending the exam even due to illness has to be the last resort
 - If you don't sit an exam, you can't get marks for that element of the specification
- No longer use 'Teacher Assessed Grades'
- **Inform school at the earliest opportunity**
- Parent/Carer to make sure a message is given directly to Jane Moore-Examination Officer
- A doctors/hospital note is necessary for an application for special consideration
- Maximum consideration is only up to 5% and this is in the most exceptional cases
- If you think your child has COVID, do not test them, contact the school.



Late to the exam....

- All candidates must arrive a minimum of ten minutes before the examination
- If you do run late, reception should be notified ASAP. The students and any adults with them, must switch off mobile devices and have no access to the internet
- If the exam is finished a student cannot sit the exam
- If the exam is still in progress a student may sit the paper however a report has to be submitted and paper may not be marked
- A student is not able to leave early - even if they have finished

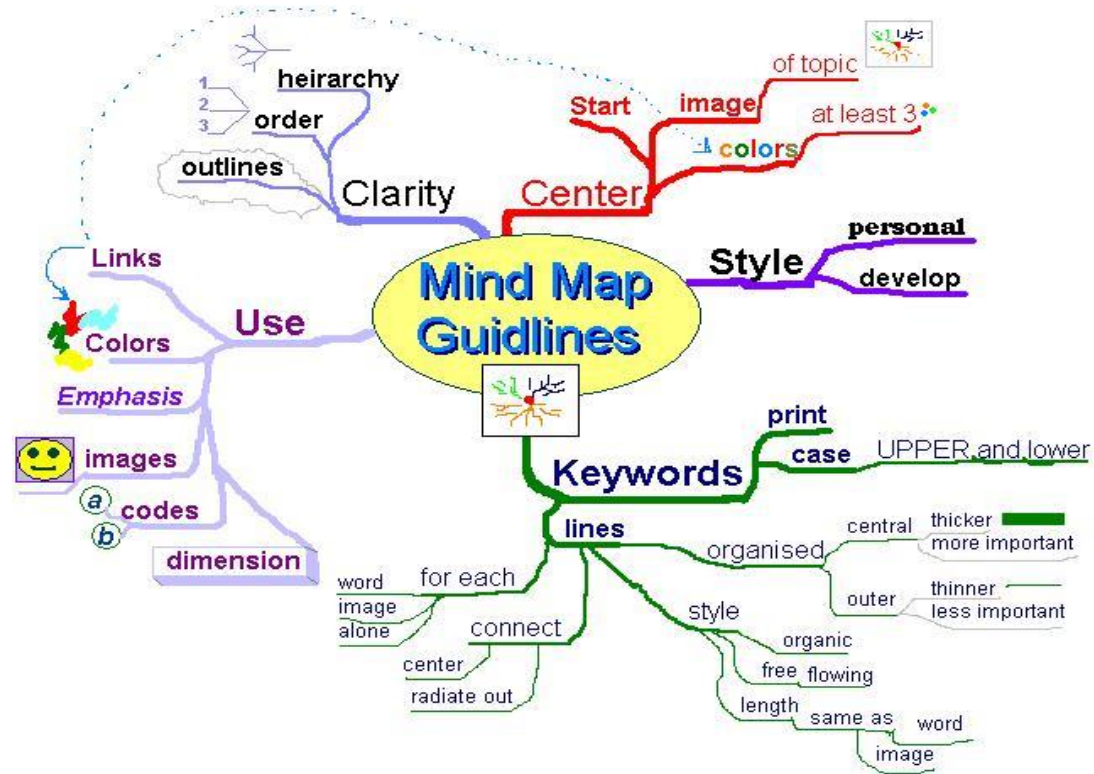



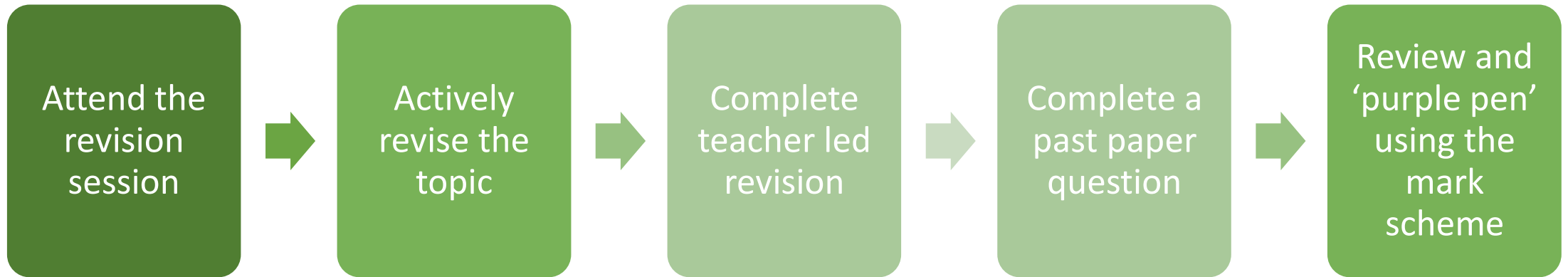
