Welcome to this year's Activity Week.

What is Activity Week?

The simple answer is that it is a time when both students and staff can share experiences that are not usually available during the rest of the academic year. Even a cursory glance at the course titles on the contents page will give you an idea of the great range of experiences available.

The normal school timetable and curriculum will be suspended for the week.

Activity Week was endorsed at our last full Ofsted inspection when the team felt that it enhanced the students' education.

Different courses are offered to specific year groups. The booklet indicates who may apply for advertised courses.

All students are expected to participate in, and benefit from, the week.

There are courses that represent some particular strength, hobby or interest that staff wish to share with others. Some courses are based in school, others are day trips and some are residential.

Some courses are expensive, some less so, while others are completely free of charge.

New skills can be learned, new friends made, new challenges met and overcome.

THE AIMS AND OBJECTIVES OF ACTIVITY WEEK

All courses arranged for the week include elements that can be identified in the various National Curriculum documents and the week is specifically designed to enrich the school curriculum and provide opportunities to:

- learn a variety of new skills
- develop self-confidence and self-reliance
- develop a sense of responsibility
- work co-operatively
- provide experiences outside the scope of the normal curriculum
- promote the achievement of short-term goals
- reinforce the development of the social and personal skills in new situations
- encourage self-assessment

Through the residential experience, there are a number of additional aims and objectives:

- to encourage corporate spirit
- to develop self-confidence, self-reliance, maturity, awareness and a sense of responsibility
- to promote and improve personal physical ability

Special note regarding charging for activities within the academic year:

The 1988 Education Act has implications regarding charging for school courses such as those outlined in this booklet:

There is no legal obligation for you to contribute and indeed no child at Lutterworth High School will be treated differently according to whether or not parent/carers have made a contribution. It must be made clear at the outset however, that courses on offer may not go ahead as planned if there is insufficient financial support.

Please take special note that:

Whilst every effort will be made to give students their first choice it is inevitable that some will have to be placed on one of their other preferences. Students should not choose any course that they would not be happy to participate in.

Courses are allocated to ensure that as many students as possible get their first choice.

Once students have accepted a place on a course it will not be possible for a student to switch to another course unless there are exceptional circumstances.

Students who are allocated a place on a paid course will be required to pay a nonrefundable deposit very soon after allocation. All payments for all courses will be handled using Scopay via the website.

The balance of all course costs must be paid by deadline dates. Failure to meet deadlines for payment, unless special arrangements have been agreed between parents and school, may result in your child forfeiting their place.

Allocating courses can be complicated and whilst we make every effort to give students their preferred option it is inevitable that some will be disappointed. We are happy to place these students on a waiting list for their preferred option.

Some residential courses require a high level of physical fitness. Students who have opted out of PE and swimming sessions at school on a long-term basis for reasons other than serious medical conditions or long-term injuries are unlikely to be allocated a place on sports-related trips.

Read the booklet carefully with your parents or carers. Remember that we will spread the payments across the year.

<u>Step 2</u>

Your parent/carer will need to complete the 'AW 2024 Course Application Form' on the Edulink App/Website & enter your three choices in order of preference.

Parents/Carers that have not yet signed up for Edulink, should email <u>edulinkapp@lutterworthhigh.co.uk</u> for set up details.

Whilst every effort will be made to allocate a student's highest preference, it is not always possible and some students will inevitably be allocated one of their other choices, **so choose wisely.**

The Edulink 'AW 2024 Course Application Form' will be available from 3pm on Friday 27th October 2023.

All forms must be submitted by 11.00am on Wednesday 1st November 2023.

The form will not be available after this time.

Please note that no course, residential or school-based, is allocated on a first come, first served basis, although any student applying after the deadline will usually be allocated after the applications received on or before the deadline.

Once applications have been received, we will collate the information. Parent/carers will be notified by email to confirm your course allocation and advise payment details.

Activity Week – Application for Financial Assistance

Trip funding guidance 2023 - 24

School trips are an essential part of a child's education, providing valuable opportunities for learning, personal growth, and social development. School trips and residential courses that take place either during, or outside of school hours often cannot be funded without voluntary contributions from parents or carers. However, we understand that some parents may face financial constraints when it comes to covering the costs of these trips. It is critical to us at Lutterworth High School that no child should be excluded from an activity simply because their parents are unwilling or unable to pay.

This guidance aims to help parents at Lutterworth High School navigate available options for financial support so that their children can participate in school outings without undue financial burden.

If insufficient voluntary contributions are raised to fund a visit and the school cannot fund it from some other source, then the visit will be cancelled.

Forward planning:

We endeavour to provide as much advance notice for school trips as is possible to support your financial budgeting. Staff plan trips to offer value for money and this is carefully considered before a trip or visit is given the go ahead.

Payment Plans:

We offer flexible payment plans, allowing parents to spread the cost of the trip over several months. These are set up automatically for residential trips but can be arranged to spread the cost of any trip. Please contact <u>finance@lutterworthhigh.co.uk</u>

Government Assistance:

Financial Assistance from the School:

If your child currently receives free school meals, we will automatically provide the following support to reduce the cost of the contributions. Course number: 1 Get Gaming

Aims and Objectives

- To experience games in different formats (virtual and non-virtual)
- To encourage creativity and independence
- To develop problem solving skills

Details of the course

You will...

- Compete in different live games, such as Escape rooms, Laser Tag, Bowling, Ninja Warrior and Mini Golf
- Visit the Retro Computer Museum, Leicester to learn about, and play with, old consoles and computers
- Use and discover different uses of Virtual Reality
- Build Lego Mindstorms robots

This course will be an exciting week for students to expand on the world of gaming, both online and offline. We might play games, or problem solve, or even program to understand how games/robots are built. All tools and resources will be provided where necessary.



Course number: 2 STEAM and CREST Award

Aims and Objectives

- To work towards completing a recognised STEM certificate (CREST Award)
- To experience 2 STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Art and Mathematics) daytrip attractions across the UK
- To develop students' communication, problem solving and teamwork skills by addressing real-world challenges over the course of the week.
- To be reflective and use ICT to communicate experiences

Details of the course

CREST is a nationally recognised scheme for student-led project work in the STEM subjects (science, technology, engineering and maths) and we will be working towards completing an award throughout the week. We will also be going on 4-day trips throughout the week, aiming to broaden students' STEAM experience. The full itinerary isn't yet confirmed, but it'll include visits such as Sea Life Centre and Lego Discovery Centre, West Midlands Safari Park, Oxford Natural History Museum and Peak District Lead Mining Museum. Most days, students will arrive back at school to get their 3pm bus home. The price of this course includes entrance fees to all venues, coach travel and insurance and completion of the CREST award. The order we do these trips and the exact costings are subject to change as and when they are booked. Further details about the venues are available online.
